

88 UNCLAIMED AND FOUR UNIDENTIFIED BODIES STILL LIE IN MORGUES

The Manipur government under the directive of the Supreme Court of India has appealed to the general masses to identify four unidentified dead bodies presently lying at the state government-run Jawaharlal Nehru Institute of Medical Sciences (JNIMS), Imphal.

The Apex Court also directed the state government to undertake the burial process of the unclaimed bodies by December 12, 2023, if they were still unclaimed.

The body of a man and remnants of three burnt human bodies are lying at JNIMS mortuary, Imphal, the state officials said on Wednesday.

There are 175 dead bodies of which, 171 have been identified.

Eighty-three of these bodies were claimed by the relatives or the next of kin, 88 were unclaimed and the remaining four bodies were unidentified in the mortuaries. For the unidentified bodies, the court directed the Manipur government to carry out the burial or cremation process keeping due observance of religious rites.

The state government has also been directed to collect DNA samples of all bodies as many deceased persons were part of numerous criminal investigations.

The Supreme Court Bench comprising Chief Justice D.Y. Chandrachud and Justices J.B. Pardiwala and Manoj Misra passed directions based on a report prepared by the committee led by Justice Gita Mittal.

The committee formed by the Supreme Court on 7 August 2023 has the humanitarian aspects such as compensation and rehabilitation of victims of the Manipur violence that erupted on May 3, 2023.

CM DESIGNATE LALDUHOMA TO TAKE MANIPUR ISSUE TO CENTRE

Zoram People's Movement (ZPM) chief and Chief Minister-elect Lalduhoma on Wednesday said that he would soon take up both the Myanmar refugee crisis and the Manipur unrest with the Centre. Chief Minister designate Lalduhoma, speaking exclusively to Northeast Live, informed that he had had a telephonic conversation with External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar the day before and that he would visit New Delhi at a convenient time and discuss the issue with him.

In regards to the Separate Administration demand by the Kukis in Manipur, the ZPM chief said, "All of them are Indian citizens. They are our brothers and sisters and we will take care of them. I spoke to Union Home Minister Amit Shah yesterday regarding the issue. We will soon sit and discuss the matter face to face."

Earlier, the CM designate, a former IPS officer, also assured that his government would continue to provide shelter and assistance to refugees from Myanmar and those displaced from Manipur. Mizos share strong ethnic ties with Manipur's Kuki and Myanmar's Chin tribes. Since February 2021,



nearly 35,000 Chin refugees from Myanmar have crossed over to the state. Around 12,000 Kuki-Zo people from Manipur have also fled to Mizoram after ethnic clashes between the Kuki and Meitei communities broke out in the state in early May.

After emerging victorious in 27 out of 40 seats in the state, the Zoram People's Movement has said that the state's position on the issue of refugees would not change. "The issue is humanitarian," Lalduhoma, a former Indian Police Service officer said.







SINZAWL VILLAGERS DECIDE TO UP THE ANTE OVER POSSIBLE Landing of state forces on village's helipad

Growing suspicious of the Meitei state government to militarize the hill areas by landing state forces using helicopter, the Sinzawl villagers under Thanlon Sub-Division in Churachandpur district today planted wooden poles at the Helipad in the village, in order to fence off any attempted move by the Meitei government to station the Meitei Police Commandos at the border between Lamka and Mizoram.

As per inputs, the villagers were alarmed about the possible deployment of Meitei Police Commandos in the border village by airlifting them from the state capital. This has raised suspicions among the locals that the helipad will be used during the airlifting process. As such, the villagers in a show of strong opposition against the proposed move, planted wooden poles at the helipad.

It may be noted here that Sinzawl is the last village in Manipur, bordering Mizoram. The famous Guite Road passes through this village. The Guite Road has been a lifeline for the Kuki tribals since the ethnic violence began in the state. The road also serves as a connecting link between the Kuki tribals and their ethnically related Mizo brothers of the neighbouring state. All medical kits, essential commodities and relief materials are transported through this road.



It is highly suspicious that on learning of the importance of this road, the Meitei led state government once again attempted to block the lifeline of the Kuki tribals who have already suffered immense hardships due to the blocking of relief supplies and medical items to the hill districts by the notorious Meira Paibis in the valley area.

That the deployment of Meitei Police Commandos would derail the smooth passage of all essential commodities passing through this road is what the Meiteis perceive, and this would mean economic hardship for the people, which they conceive as one way of suppressing the movement for separate administration.

GOC-IN-C EASTERN COMMAND MEETS MANIPUR CM, GUV

Lt Gen RP Kalita, PVSM, UYSM, AVSM, SM, VSM, General Officer Commanding in Chief, Eastern Command arrived Imphal on a four day visit to the North-Eastern state.

During the visit, GOC-in-C reached Manipur on December 6 and interacted with the Governor of Manipur, Anusuiya Uikey and Chief Minister N Biren Singh. GOC-in-C was accompanied by GOC, Spear Corps, a press release issued by PRO & Spokesperson, Ministry of Defence, Manipur, Nagaland and Southern Arunachal Pradesh informed.

During the meeting, Kalita discussed the current security scenario in the state of Manipur and further various aspects related to strengthening cooperation and ensuring security for the people of Manipur were discussed, the press release stated.









MPCC'S DOUBLE-STANDARD EXPOSED OVER THE KILLING OF 13 Meitei militants

The double standard of Manipur Pradesh Congress Committee (MPCC) has come to light in the backdrop of the killing of 13 Meitei insurgent cadres in Tengnoupal district on December 4.

When unarmed Kukis and civilians were ambushed, waylaid, tortured, brutally raped and murdered by the Meitei militants including the radicalised groups of Arambai Tenggol and Meitei Leepun, the Manipur Congress remained silent, uttering no words of condemnation. However, when Meiteis were killed as a result of a retaliatory strike by the Kukis, the Manipur Congress organised a press conference condemning the killings. Such is the double-standard of all Meiteis irrespective of their party affiliation.

The Manipur Pradesh Congress Committee (MPCC) on Wednesday expressed deep sorrow and condemnation against the brutal killing of 13 Meitei youths. Addressing the media during a press conference held at Congress Bhavan today, K. Meghachandra, MPCC President, said that the MPCC and also the AICC strongly condemned the brutal killing of 13 unarmed youths at a place which is in close proximity of an Assam Rifles post and called it "genocide."

Strongly condemning the government of India for their inactiveness towards ending the seven month old crisis of Manipur, the President of the Manipur Pradesh Congress Committee (MPCC) K. Meghachandra also expressed skepticism as to how long the people of Manipur would continue to suffer due to a conflict which is more likely to be a genocidal mission.

He said that Prime Minister Narendra or Home Minister Amit Shah didn't utter a single word on the brutal killings of 13 (thirteen) youths of Manipur at a place which is in close proximity of an Assam Rifles Post in Tengnoupal District on December 4.



K. Meghachandra needs to answer the following questions:

1. Does MPCC have a close relation with the Meitei militants who were killed due to their mischievous mission?

2. Why did the militants go to the interior part of the hills in the midst of the ethnic war between the two communities?

3. Did the MPCC ever condemn the brutal killings of Kuki civilians by the Meitei militants?

4. Are the lives of the Meiteis more precious than that of the Kukis?

With the deep divide of the state under the BJP-led government, the Manipur Congress must learn to rise beyond partisanship politics.

While urging the three MPs from the state to put up the grievances of the people due to the ongoing crisis during the upcoming parliament session, Meghachandra also claimed that India is playing a double game in the Myanmar violence which is having an impact on Manipur and other neighbouring states of India.







TANGKHUL FRONTAL ORGANISATIONS ISSUE STERN WARNING TO MEITEIS, SERVE 48-HOUR ULTIMATUM

The Tangkhul Frontal Organisations today through a Press Communique issued a stern warning to the Meitei community over the case of assault on three persons from the Tangkhul community by the Meiteis, serving a 48-hour ultimatum to the state government to book the culprits.

Strongly condemning the callous act meted out against 3 (three) persons from the Tangkhul community heading to Ukhrul from Imphal on 3rd December 2023, the Tangkhul Frontal Organizations' PC said that the victims were stopped at Sawombung by around 30-40 Meira Paibis and inquired as to their identities. Thereby they produced their Aadhaar cards and were thus verified. However, before they were relieved, one gypsy with 5 armed men came and took them to a place of about 5 mins travel distance from the place where they were stopped initially. Then, they were kept separately at a distance, interrogated and blamed as informants of Kukis, beaten severely and threatened to be killed by having guns pointed at them and being told that their bodies would be disposed of in the river. Then they were again taken to another location and continued to be terrorised and asked to run, which they refused saying that they had done nothing wrong.

"The atrocious act inflicted on the innocent citizens is inhumane and unwarranted." The Press Communique continues, "Such incident has accustomed in the name of safeguarding the community interest or mistaken identity. In many such past incidents, the community in good faith has tolerated enough with the sense of forgiveness. However, the repeated atrocities meted to the innocent citizens have once again broken the secured feelings and called our attention to question the intention of the specific community i.e. the Meitei. Therefore, in the light of this matter, we condemned the Meira Paibis working hand in gloves with the armed groups.

TENSIONS ESCALATE IN TAMU REGION OF MYANMAR; HUMAN CASUALTIES, BURNING OF HOUSES REPORTED

In response to the ongoing pro-democratic resistant forces' offensive being launched in several places, the Myanmar's military regime on Wednesday has escalated its campaign of atrocities over civilians at Htantapin – a Mizo village, located six miles away from the Tamu township, thereby killing four persons and razing about 200 houses to the ground.

In recent weeks, while the pro-democracy groups have been successful in capturing various strategic locations, the Junta forces and the Valley Based Insurgent Groups (VBIGs) from Manipur, India, started launching retaliatory strikes against the pro-democracy forces, attacking Htantapin village in Sagaing Region leading to the burning down of 200 houses in the village.

Amidst the escalating tension, the People's Democratic Force (PDF), who were stationed at Khampat, also came under heavy attack by the Pro-Junta Combined Forces. The Combined Junta Forces captured six PDF cadres, two of them escaped while the rest have been killed mercilessly by the pro-Junta forces.

Among the four slain cadres, one of them belongs to the Kuki community, and hails from Janglenphai village. It has also been reported that the pro-Junta forces made their way from Khumnoi village.


The attack against the pro-democracy force came against the backdrop of the November 20 waging war against the pro-democracy forces.

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ZPM LEADER LALDUHOMA TO MEET MIZORAM GUV TODAY TO STAKE Claim to form govt

After winning the Assembly polls in Mizoram, Zoram People's Movement (ZPM) leader Lalduhoma, who is also the Chief Ministerial candidate of the party will meet the state Governor today and stake claim to form the government.

Lalduhoma will meet Governor Hari Babau Kambhampati at Raj Bhawan in Aizawl today at around 10:30 am.

ZPM registered a landslide victory by winning 27 out of 40 assembly constituencies in Mizoram, of which results were declared on December 4.

After leading ZPM to a landslide victory in Mizoram, party chief Lalduhoma, who is set to take over from Zoramthanga as the next chief minister, said the state's youth were fed up with the incumbent, the Mizo National Front (MNF), and wanted a new regime to come in with fresh ideas and principles.

"This is the blessing of God & the blessing of the people for which I am very happy & thankful. We had been expecting (such a big win) right from the previous year. We know the mood of the people. We know that they are in our favour...



There is no contender at all...They had already selected me last year. It was already announced to the people that if ZPM returns to power Lalduhoma is going to be the CM. That is known by the people right from the previous year. There are many issues, as a government we have 45 departments looking after various things... After the swearing-in ceremony is over, I am going to have a press meeting for the first time as the CM. I am going to announce our top priorities" the CM designate said.

MNF REJECTS ZORAMTHANGA'S RESIGNATION AFTER ELECTION DEBACLE

The MNF, which was trounced in the Mizoram Assembly election, Wednesday rejected the resignation of its president Zoramthanga and agreed that he will continue in the post, party sources said.

The national core committee and political affairs committee of MNF rejected Zoramthanga's resignation and lauded his gesture of taking the moral responsibility of his defeat, MNF senior vice-president Tawnluia said.

The meeting felt that the election outcome is the collective responsibility of the party and not of the president alone, he said.

Zoramthanga, who served as chief minister of the state for 30 long years, had put in his papers following the party's debacle in the election. The counting of votes was held on Monday. "The MNF failed to win the state assembly polls. In this regard, I take moral responsibility as the party chief. Considering that it is my obligation as the MNF president, I do hereby tender resignation from the president post and request you to accept the same," Zoramthanga said in his resignation letter to Tawnluia on Tuesday.

Zoramthanga has been the MNF president since the death of Laldenga in 1990.

The 79-year-old MNF chief has so far successfully contested assembly polls for six times in 1987, 1989, 1993, 1998, 2003 and 2018. He served as chief minister between 1998 and 2008 and 2018 and 2023.

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On 29th November, 2023, the Home Minister of India, Shri Amit Shah, shared on his twitter post that the oldest insurgent group in Manipur, UNLF, had signed a ceasefire agreement with the Government of India. This was also enthusiastically shared and trumpeted by Biren Singh and a grand reception was held at Kangla Fort for the surrendered rebels. There was also news of people bursting fire-crackers in Imphal in celebration. Little did they know that their 60 years of independence movement just went up in smoke. Keeping aside the BJP Karyakartas who would have wanted to show that Biren had done something great, the common people among the Meiteis and sections of their intellectuals would have viewed it with mixed feelings. For one, thousands of Meiteis have lost their lives fighting for an independent Kangleipak. For them, it would be a betrayal to lay down their arms now.

Interestingly, the founders of the United National Liberation Front (UNLF) even had a Kuki and a Naga in their top ranks. Much water has flowed down the Imphal River and Kukis and Meiteis have now become such staunch enemies that it is unlikely that they will ever live together again.

For the BJP leadership in Delhi, it would have been more about theatrics than substance as they wanted to show that the BJP could do what the

Congress could not! The mainland Hindu vote-bank would not understand anyway that it was just one faction of one Meitei armed group amongst the many.

BJP might rejoice when one faction of UNLF signs a ceasefire. Meanwhile the other faction of UNLF, PREPAK, PREPAK(Pro), PLA, KYKL, etc. must be watching, and either laughing at their 'innocence ', naivety and media stunt, or some might even contemplate joining the ceasefire bandwagon given their precarious situation in Myanmar! However, it might not be easy to give up the idea of 'independence' for those who had laboured for it for the last many decades. Unlike politicians who are interested in protecting their 'Musical Chairs', there are those who had genuinely joined the independence movement believing in its ideals.

Had Meitei politicians not fallen into the trap of thinking that Manipur belongs only to them, the independence movement might have had some takers even in the hills. In fact, Kuki undergrounds were willing to even have a solution within Manipur. Alas! Things have gone too far now. Biren did not foresee that his hatred for the Kuki-Zo would not only harm the Kuki-Zo but also the Meiteis, his own people. The ethnic cleansing that started on 3rd May, 2023, has not only led to the death of hundreds of Meiteis and Kuki-Zo, it seems that the dream of Meiteis' independent

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
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Kangleipak kingdom has also come to an end. Biren succeeded in ending what thousands of Meiteis had laid down their lives for! What they laboured for 60 years comes to an end fighting the Kukis. In a sense, it might be even shameful for the remaining Meitei secessionist groups to join the ceasefire because it will be considered that they are doing so only for fear of the Kuki-Zo! However, Biren has already ploughed the road open, and if the other groups refuse to join, chances of a civil war within the Meitei community cannot be ruled out.

It would also be interesting to watch how Delhi reacts if some in the Meitei community continue to fight for independence. It would obviously go against BJP's nationalist rhetoric, and they would be seen aiding a community that wants secession against a (Kuki) community that has always been loyal. Lastly, coming to the role of the Arambai Tenggol, the original Arambais of the 19th Century at least fought valiantly even though they could not protect the Meitei kings against Burmese invasion. The present day Arambais now ignorantly declare war on Kukis who had helped defend Manipur during that said Ava War. Today, the Arambai Tenggols could not stop their Chief Minister from nailing the final nail in a coffin of a gradually weakening independence movement that seeks to re-write the Merger Agreement. There would obviously be whisperers in the corridors of power in Imphal and market places that their 60 plus years of independence movement came to an end simply because an elected Chief Minister foolishly declared war on the Kukis. Biren ignominiously earned himself the badge of the man who brought down the curtains of the once powerful and glorious 'Manipur kingdom restoration movement'.
